
Mission Statement

Head Start provides a supportive environment that encourages children, families, staff, and communities to thrive by identifying strengths and opportunities, and developing strong partnerships to meet needs.

West Central Head Start operates a publicly funded program that serves children birth to 5 and pregnant women in Douglas, Grant, Otter Tail, Pope, Stevens, Traverse and Wadena counties.

WCMCA Head Start operated 9 full-day classrooms and 9 half-day classrooms, providing services from September – May.

Home based services are offered year-round with 12 Home Visitors providing weekly home visits to each enrolled family as well as 2 parent socialization events a month.



Health Services at End of Enrollment

- \Rightarrow 97% of HS children and 95% EHS children have health insurance.
- \Rightarrow 99% of HS children and 89% of EHS children have a medical home.
- \Rightarrow 89% of HS children and 62% of EHS children are up-to-date on well child care.
- \Rightarrow 97% of HS children and 95% of EHS children are current on immunizations.
- \Rightarrow 97% of HS children have completed a dental exam and 88% of EHS children have a dental home.

School Readiness: WCMCA Head Start helps children succeed by linking Curriculum and Assessment, using observation-based assessment information to individualize children's learning.



- 499 parents volunteered for a total of 13,844 hours.
- 100% of families received services such as housing assistance, ESL, emergency intervention, health or parent education, etc.
- 73 mental health referrals were made, with 37 children receiving services as a result.

Pope County Cooking Matters consisted of 8 participants with 5 of those attending all 6 classes held at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Glenwood. Cooking Matters is a nutrition education program hosted by WCMCA Head Start, with funding provided by United Way of Pope and Douglas Counties, Cooking Matters Minnesota, EC Thrive and WCMCA along with partnerships from UMM Extension and a local chef volunteering time & mileage.

By the end of the year, 22% of children were on an IEP/IFSP
